

"Times Haven't Changed"

As I was doing research for a Bible Study recently, the author of one of the commentaries I use cited a study he had recently read. In that study, which involved five thousand Americans from a wide spectrum of backgrounds and demographics, the following findings stood out:

- 93% of those polled stated that their judgment about right and wrong was based *solely* on their personal beliefs. They felt no impact from the law, from threat of police action, from religion, or from family values.
- 74% said they would steal from those who would not miss it.
- Almost 50% of college students cheat.
- Upwards of 24% of all resumes contain false information. Similarly, the study showed a greater number of those willing to lie on financial aid forms.
- 64% said they would lie when it suits them if it caused no "real" damage. 1

The sad thing is that the commentary I was using was published in 2002 – so this poll is something like 25 years old! I am sure if the same poll were taken today, the results would be the same if not a little worse!

The Good News is that none of this is a surprise to God. In fact, the Bible is surprisingly frank when it comes to the sinfulness of human beings – it records some truly awful things that have been done throughout history. Right there in the very beginning, we see Cain murdering his brother Abel. We see King David breaking 5 of the 10 commandments in 1 chapter as he sins against Bathsheba and Uriah. We see the vile Haman attempt genocide against God's people in the Book of Esther. We see Salome and her mother, Herodias, conspire together to have John the Baptist beheaded. We see the poor Simon Magus try to buy the power of the Holy Spirit. And of course, then there's Judas Iscariot – he betrayed his friend and his God for 30 pieces of silver. The Bible is no record of stained-glass saints; it is the record of God's dealings with rebellious, sinful, broken people, and His faithfulness to them and to His promises to them.

And as the poll shows us: human nature has not changed in the ensuing centuries! We sometimes like to fool ourselves into thinking that people are getting better, smarter, wiser, or that our society is evolving into something greater or better. But as the author of aforementioned commentary writes: "Despite what Bob Dylan may have written years ago, the times haven't changed all that much. We continue to be a deprayed, sinful people in need of God's moral law and God's civil law

if we hope to live according to His will for our lives."²

And that's a big reason why the Church makes such a big deal about the season of Lent, which starts this month. Lent is a time of preparation, a time of discipline, a time of humbling – it's a time when we recognize our sinfulness, our *need* for Jesus. And it's a time when we prepare yet again to celebrate and to receive the incredible work Jesus did for us on the cross and at the empty tomb. For if we ever doubt how truly depraved and sinful we are, we simply need to look at the cross. It stands as a stark testimony to how truly *awful* sin is – that it took *this* to bring about our forgiveness. And at the same time, if we ever doubt the love and goodness and faithfulness of God, again, all we need to do is to look at the cross – for God *so loved us* that He *did this!*

So in this season of Lent, look hard at your life. Look at your sins. Admit what is right there in front of your face, even if it's horrible and embarrassing. Perhaps you're one of those people who would lie on a financial aid form, or who would take something that isn't yours provided no one would miss it. Perhaps you have something even worse to admit about yourself. This is the season to be honest about all these things. And then, *look at the cross*. Look at your salvation – freely given in Christ! Look and rejoice! Look and give thanks! Look and then tell what you see to everyone you can. For God knows our sins; He knows our need; He knows the worst things about us. And He went to the cross for us anyway – so that we might have eternal life with Him! Hallelujah! To Him alone be the glory!




Coffee & Tea With the Pastor
